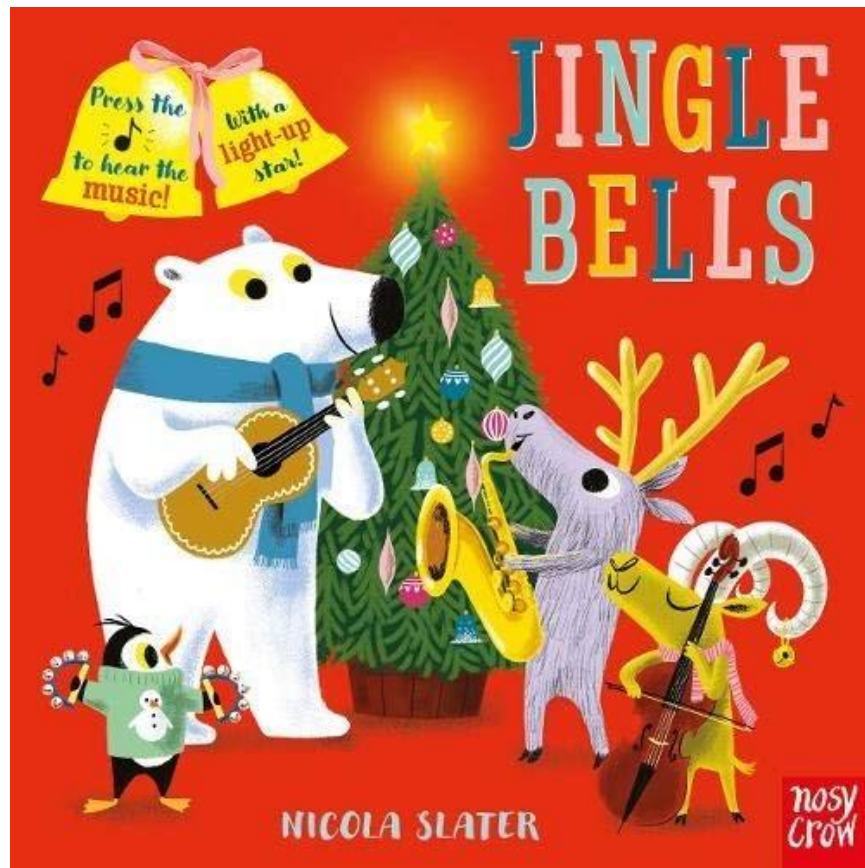

On this day British people celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ.

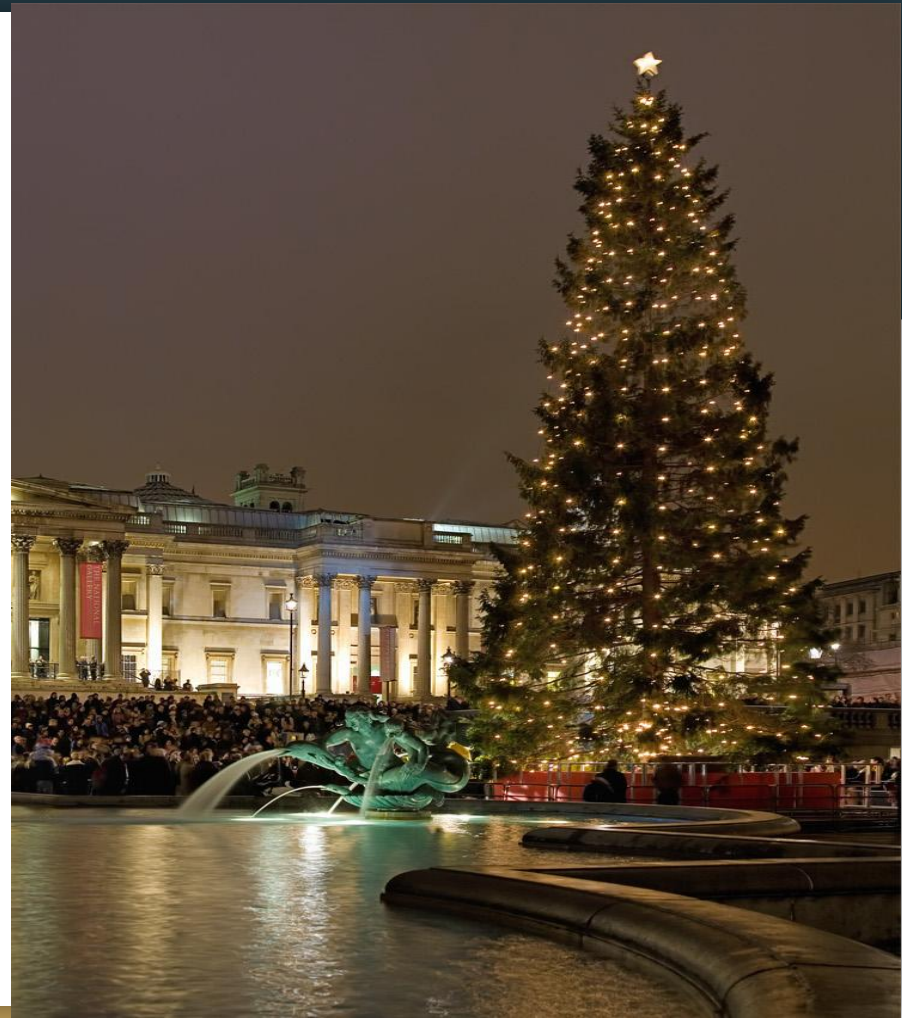
This holiday means the beginning of the new year and the new live.

Santa Claus comes at night and puts present in the colorful stockings and under the Christmas tree. In the morning children find their presents there.



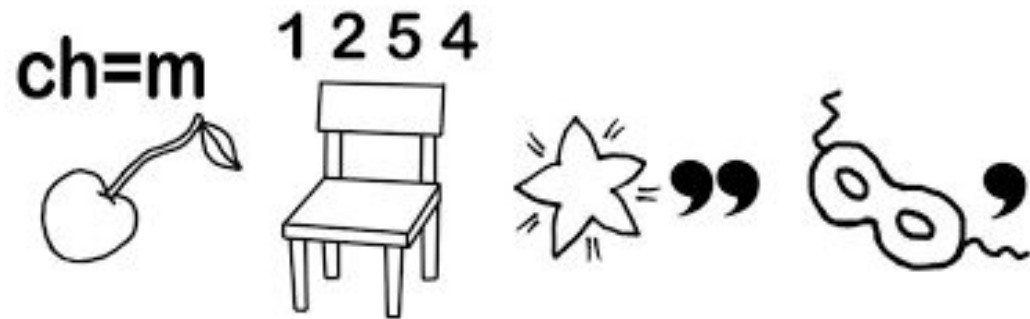
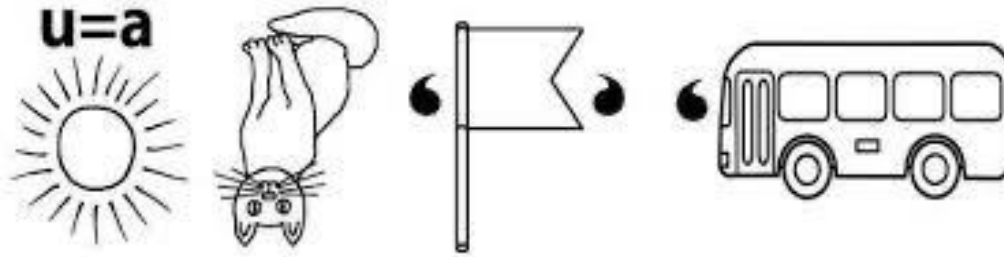
